Project Renewal Campaign Exceeds \$3 Million Goal



Because of generous donors like you, Via Christi Philanthropy was able to surpass its goal of \$3 million for Project Renewal. The \$3.3 million raised will go toward construction of a psychiatric observation unit that will open later this year and a patient activity center, for which construction will be complete by late 2019.

“Via Christi’s commitment to expanding behavioral health services is important to the quality of life for our community. I appreciate the members of the St. Joseph Renewal Vision Committee and the nearly 100 donors who contributed to help us reach the \$3 million goal,” said Lyndon Wells, who chairs the Via Christi Health Board of Directors and played a key role in Project Renewal.

In addition to the capital goal, \$236,000 has been donated to date for behavioral health research, programming and community collaboration. Fundraising efforts to enhance integrated behavioral health care at Via Christi and the Wichita community is ongoing.

Via Christi Volunteers Contribute \$210,000 for New Ambulance

Via Christi Health has a new \$210,000 ambulance thanks to a grant from its volunteers. It now serves as the primary transport vehicle for the nearly 150 patients who are transferred each month between Via Christi’s five Wichita hospital campuses to get specialized services such as OB, oncology and psychiatric.



“We are happy to support the purchase of this critical transport vehicle and share in Via Christi’s mission to improve the health of individuals and communities,” says Karon Mitchell, board president of **Via Christi Volunteers - Partners in Caring**, which has approximately 800 active Wichita-area adult and teen volunteers.

“We’re excited to have a more up-to-date vehicle with an electric lift system for loading patients,” says Kris Hill, chief nursing officer for Via Christi Hospital St. Francis, who oversees ambulatory and transport services. “This is an important safety feature for staff and the patients they transport.”
